Bay Area Women's Center has served the community since 1975. All services at BAWC are provided free-of-charge to individuals of any gender identity whose lives have been impacted by domestic violence or sexual assault. Secondary victims, typically the children of survivors, are also eligible to receive services. The comprehensive programs are implemented by highly-trained staff to ensure all the needs of survivors are met.

BY THE NUMBERS:

24-HOUR CRISIS HOTLINE

Crisis Hotline operators answered **615 calls** and provided **157 hours** of crisis counseling and intervention

EMERGENCY SHELTER

119 adults and **137 children** spent **9,860 nights** in shelter - **29,580 meals** were served in shelter. Average stay of **39 nights**

SEXUAL ASSAULT PROGRAM (SANE)

Specially trained nurses conducted **25 sexual assault exams**: **21 adult & adolescent** | **4 children (under age 12)**

VICTIM ADVOCACY

417 unduplicated clients received assistance
34 clients were assisted in getting personal protection orders

INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING

Over **2,739 hours** of counseling provided to **292 women**, **12 men**, **1 transgender adult**, **2 non-binary adults**, and **110 children**

NON-RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

166 women, **12 men**, **1 non-binary adult**, and **60 children** received non-residential services

2,000+ youth and adults participated in prevention education sessions or community awareness activities

"Before I moved into the shelter at BAWC, everyday was a struggle. My abuser didn't let me have a job, and the only money he gave me was closely monitored. I was constantly looking over my shoulder, wondering when he would get home and what he would do to me or our son. I was scared, depressed, and uncertain of my future. I knew I needed to take control and make a change.

A room was available at BAWC. When I got into my shelter bedroom, there was a bag filled with personal care items waiting for me. This was a huge relief. I was

already trying to figure out how I would be able to afford a toothbrush or diapers.

BAWC took care of all the basic things. They keep a stocked pantry so I was able to make the food that my son likes. I could do laundry on site. If I needed to go to a job interview or the store, BAWC had bus passes to help. I was finally in a place where I was safe and cared for.

The peace of mind that feeling safe gave me helped me to dream again. Having my own job and freedom could be my reality. I'm finally excited for the future."
